Longspurs -- Uncommon to rare fall transients and wintering visitants to California.

Travel with **Horned Larks** (ssp leucolaema in so.Cal): $7\frac{1}{4}$ " with pale backs & yellowish throat outlined with a dark crescent; white belly, black horn & black stripe under eye. longer gray bill and dark legs. Flight calls high, rather soft, weak, lisping see=tu or see titi and other variations, some buzzy notes.

Longspurs are 6 ¼" with streaked backs, distinctive auricular patches, wing markings, light legs, small light bills, light malar stripes, tending to fly on outer edges or back of mixed flocks.

Habitat: bare ground to short and bit taller weeds.
